



Dear Parents and Carers

We have all felt particularly safe today due to the number of **heroes** present! Year 1 and Year 2 have been dressed as superheroes, every day heroes like firefighters and paramedics and children's own heroes including Florence Nightingale, a Great Uncle from the RAF, a grandma and a suffragette. Thanks for supporting this fun day – it does seem to have inspired the children who are very much enjoying this topic. Thanks are due to parents and staff who have volunteered themselves or others to come and speak to the children. They have particularly enjoyed visits from Poppy (Rudee's mum) a paramedic, PC Jamie Wilkinson, a representative from Guide Dogs for the Blind and Owain Black, Mrs Black's husband. Owain Black is a high school teacher and has cerebral palsy. All classes were shown his picture in advance of Monday's visit and were allowed to ask any questions they wanted. He then led an assembly on **disability** where he answered children's questions frankly and the children decided with him that they wouldn't like a school where everybody was the same.

Other visitors this week have included the tutors from **d:side** who came to deliver our annual spring sessions on medicines, alcohol and drugs. We invite them to school each year, which means children cover the full range of topics in an age appropriate way in their seven years with us. Please do ask you child what they have been learning.



Our final visitor this week was Anna Simons, also a parent at our school, who is involved with the **Headingley Neighbourhood Plan**. The idea of the plan is to write a statutory document that will be used by the council and others when making decisions about our local area.
