HEART OF A CHILD



There are about 1 million orphans in Nepal, according to UNICEF. Causes for abandonment are death of parents due to

the Maoist militancy movement, sickness, and/or difficult living conditions as well as natural disasters which have left hundreds of thousands homeless and hungry. The damage is again on the verge of being catastrophic for millions of children. An aid worker, referring to a remote village in Nepal, said, "Very tender children are dying here, uncared for, unlooked after - orphaned by the untimely death of their parents. You can see hundreds of real orphans here...those who don't have a father or a mother."



We hope to create a long term relationship with this orphanage so that with your help we can brighten up these children's future.
