Dear Parents and Carers

Our topic Our topic this term is 'Buckets and Spades'. We will learn about the geographical features of seaside places and make comparisons between a seaside town and Headingley. We will also use simple compass directions and continue to identify on globes, maps and atlases the countries of the United Kingdom, the seven continents and five oceans in our ongoing geography work. In Science we will learn about different types of animals and their habitats.

English We are starting the term reading traditional tales in class. Later on we will read stories set at the seaside. We will continue to work on writing clear sentences, linking with connectives (such as and, but, so, because), using capital letters and full stops correctly and using adjectives. We will build up to writing simple stories based on traditional tales and the seaside. Our phonics work will include consolidation of the phonemes we have already learnt as we prepare for the Year 1 phonics test. Please note that the children will be unaware that this is a test when they read the words to one of us.

Maths In Maths we will continue to work regularly on our Passport targets to secure basic facts and skills. To achieve each target, the children have to say or write their answers in 30 seconds so it's really helpful to practise each target regularly at home. Please ask if your child needs an updated copy of his or her current Passport targets.

We will also continue to work on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Problem solving will be an important part of our maths, when children are encouraged to apply their knowledge and skills and to persevere when they are stuck.

Trips and visitors We are hoping to arrange a trip to Filey to enhance our learning about the geography of seaside places and the habitats of some of the animals that live there.

Clothes and equipment Please make sure your child has PE kit in school. We will aim to have PE outdoors as often as possible this term so joggers would be useful until the weather warms up. As always, please make sure that everything is labelled and placed in a named bag. We prefer kit to stay at school for the full half term. It can be washed in the half term holiday!

It is very helpful if you can provide a named water bottle for your child. These are refilled every morning. As the weather improves, a sunhat, sunglasses and sun cream are also useful. We can't apply the cream but we will remind children to do it.

How you can help? Regular reading with your child is vital in Year 1. This should be a short session of about ten minutes at least three times per week to enable your child to practise their phonic skills and to recognise tricky words by sight. Please date and sign your child's reading record so that we know they have read their home reading books. These will continue to be changed on Wednesdays. Library books are changed on Mondays.

You will receive a separate homework leaflet with details about our big homework project this half term and ideas for other activities you can do together at home. Please remember that the most important homework you can do is reading together regularly, practising phonics and spellings and helping children to learn facts for their Maths Passport targets.

As always, please ask if there is anything that you need clarifying or if we can help in any way.
