

Letter 2 18th September 2020

Dear Parents and Carers

Today was a sad but celebratory day for many people in school as Reverend Tony Whatmough from St Michael's came to say goodbye to us. Rev Tony (as the children call him) was due to retire this spring and we had a special surprise church service planned for him. Lockdown scuppered our planning, and also Tony's retirement, but he is now about to move on from the parish. Rev Tony – and Meg the dog – are well known in the community and in our school and we will miss him. As we couldn't gather together for a service or assembly, Tony instead came to the door of each classroom and was treated to special thank yous and goodbyes from Year One all the way to Year Six. There were homemade cards, greetings in different languages, a personalised cheerleading routine, singing, pictures and special prayers. We gave him some special glassware with Shire Oak acorns to remember us by and Meg the dog got a specially customised dog lead from us. We wish Tony all the best for his retirement and thank him for his support, encouragement and visits over the last few years.

Thank you for all the donations of **school uniform** that we have received. We have had to temporarily pause collecting new-

to-you uniform as we were running out of space to store it (and the caretaking team who usually sort it out have been busy disinfecting all day long!) Kate Wright (FOSOPS) has kindly taken on the task of sorting it out for now. Please watch out for an email from Chris Marshall, our Computing Lead, about **access to digital devices** at home. In the event of us having to close a bubble or local restrictions being put in place, it would be very useful to us to know who struggles to access the learning that we share online. That way we would know where to target any support we are able to access from the government scheme or from our own stocks. Ideally we would love to lend every child a ChromeBook that could be dedicated to school work, but as that won't be possible we are trying to find out what the needs are in our community. Similarly, where connection to the Internet is by mobile phone data only, or there is none, it would be helpful to know that in case we can help with wifi dongles, or similar. Please use the last question to explain anything you think we ought to know.

You may be pleased to know that are currently exploring how to get some of our after school and lunchtime clubs up

and running again. Some, like choirs, are still restricted by government guidelines but we hope to trial some before half term with a view to developing as full a programme as we can this term and in the spring term. Ordinarily we do not seek permission from parents for lunchtime clubs such as Lego Club, but if there will be any mixing of bubbles, we will. Please, therefore, keep an eye out for club letters, even if you are not planning for your child to stay after school to do any activities.

Reception, Year One and Year Two are now eating their **lunch** in the dining hall which brings us another step closer to serving hot dinners again. (Although most children are quite enjoying the novelty of the grab bags for now!) Reception Class impressed us last week on their first lunchtime. We are sorry that we could not invite parents to join us this year – although it maybe made Monday a little easier with no confused children wondering why their grown up wasn't joining them every day for lunch!



The **roofing** works are due to be finished by the middle of next week, with all the scaffolding, etc. removed the following weekend. We are proud of how sensible the children have been when they have seen workers on the roof. The weather forecast for the end of next week suggests we may well get an early chance to check just how watertight the new roof is! Please can I remind you that we try to avoid keeping the children in at playtimes and are getting outdoors as much as possible – especially for PE. Please ensure the children have **appropriate footwear and coats** to cope with whatever the weather throws at us. This Wednesday the teachers enjoyed their staff meeting which was training with Ian Martin on the use of **The Ridge** for walks and Forest School activities. Perhaps you spotted us with our clipboards? Again, having stout shoes and a coat in school help us to be able to use the lovely natural spaces on our doorstep.

Thank you to families for keeping us up to date about any reasons for **absence**. Not surprisingly after such a long period away from school, children (and adults) are picking up colds, etc. For runny and bunged up noses you can just follow what you would normally do to decide whether your child is well enough to come to school. If, however, it is accompanied by a new persistent or continuous cough, a high temperature or altered/lost sense of smell and/or taste then a COVID-19 test should be sought. I know this can be frustrating when you know your children so well, but we must follow the guidance. The national testing system has not coped well with the surge in demand as schools and workplaces have reopened. Leeds has put in place some emergency testing sites and if you absolutely cannot get a test then please ask if we can share the details of the sites. We also have a small number of home test kits in school, for anyone facing significant barriers to getting tested.

Finally, I understand that the **Headingley Pre School** on our site have closed temporarily following a confirmed case of COVID in their community. Although the person became symptomatic a few days after being in contact with Pre School during their induction week, an abundance of caution and staff shortages due to isolation on the advice of Public Health England mean that they will be closed until the 25th September. They have informed families affected. Unless Pre School children themselves become symptomatic this does not affect their siblings attending school.

What does it cost?

We aim to keep Music Centre fees as affordable as possible. There is an enrolment fee of £36, payable once per family, to join the Music Centre. If you only want to take one class and are joining on your own, the enrolment fee is just £19 (under 18) or £26 (adult).

A fee is then payable for each class or group you join. The easiest way to pay is via a monthly direct debit, which spreads the cost for the 27 weeks that Music Centres are open over ten equal instalments (October to July).

You can also pay in advance for the whole year if you wish. Cash, cheques and credit cards are accepted.

Concessions Families on qualifying benefits (including Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit and others) may be eligible for a discount of up to 66% on the above prices, to a maximum of £100 per student.
