Please find attached another newsletter about staying safe online that was produced for Safer Internet Day.



PS World Book Day is coming up soon! Amongst other reading and writing activities that day we will be having a dress up day so it may be worth spending some time this weekend thinking about favourite books and authors. We never want

parents to feel pressurised into buying costumes for things like this — it should be a celebration of reading, not a money-making exercise! Some costumes are more props than clothes, e.g. George's Marvellous Medicine: spoon and a bottle; Billionaire Boy: a big wad of cash; Tracy Beaker: a diary. Danny the Champion of the World wears outdoorsy clothes, a long cardigan can be Hogwart's robes, Tom Palmer's football books have sports kit mentioned and Sophie in the BFG is mostly in pyjamas. Some children do not like dressing up or a change to their school routine and that is, of course, fine. Many book characters wear school uniform, so that might be an option. Alternatively, wearing a sticker or badge with a quote from a favourite book can be a good way to share. What we want from the day is a chance to talk about a love of books and to pick up recommendations for great future reading which is why costumes based on books, rather than films, is the aim.
