The new school year feels like a good time to produce an annual update from the members of the Shire Oak Governing Body to keep you informed about our membership and activities.

Who we are

The Governing Body is made up of local community representatives, Foundation (Church) Governors appointed by the Diocese of West Yorkshire and the Dales, Shire Oak parents and carers, Local Authority Governors, Staff and the Head Teacher. Please refer to the box below to see our current Governors.

What we do

The Governing Body's priority is to make things as good as they can be for the children of Shire Oak whilst ensuring that the School meets its strategic priorities. We meet as a full committee 5 times a year and we also meet once a term in a two smaller sub-committees which are focussed on specific aspects of school life: One concerned with academic achievement and progress, the curriculum, behaviour and attendance, the wider school community and partnerships, and the second is concerned with the school budget, the building, health and safety, infrastructure and resources including staffing.

Our role is to gather evidence about what is happening in school and to review and monitor schools activities, constructively challenging School management to ensure that they are meeting the school priorities. Further details are on the Governors page on the Shire Oak website:

The School priorities for the 2023-24 school year are:

- Articulating and embedding the Shire Oak ways of teaching as we have new teaching staff and changes to year group taught.
- To ensure that our broad and balanced curriculum is well led and understood and that our sequence for teaching is structured for children to be successful.
- To embed a consistent, whole school approach to the teaching of English including early reading and writing (phonics), reading and writing.
- To embed a consistent, whole school approach to the teaching of maths in line with mastery principles. (Representation and structure; mathematical thinking; variation; fluency; and coherence.)

Our regular activities

There are lots of things that the Governing Body looks at regularly. These include health and safety at the school, finances, safeguarding, the children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development, the school's website, policies, and values, as well as taking part in the performance management of the Head Teacher and recruitment of new staff.

We are members of the Advisory Board for the Headingley, Horsforth and Ireland Wood Children's Centre and take an active interest in the running of the Acorn Club and the Headingley Pre-School.

As Governors we spend a lot of time examining school and benchmark data as well as revising school documents to make sure they best reflect the current situation at the school and the needs of our

children. We also keep up-to-date with developments in Government education policy, both nationally and from Leeds City Council and the Diocese and adapt what school is doing accordingly.

Parent, pupil and staff surveys

We commit to undertaking surveys of the key school stakeholders; parent/carers, pupils and staff, at least once a year and we monitor feedback and compare trends year on year, which is a vital source of information. We value the feedback that we receive and encourage you to take part when asked!
