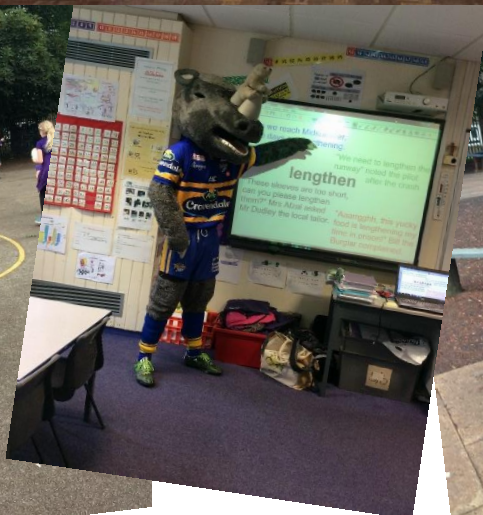




Dear Parents and Carers
