# DIY laundry liquid from foraged conkers



Collect your conkers: a shopping bagful will make around 50 washes.



Put them in a cloth bag and smash them up with a hammer to crush them.



Put 2 heaped tablespoons of crushed conkers in hot water.



Sieve the water. This is your laundry liquid and can be put in the machine drawer.



Dry the rest out and keep to make more liquid soap whenever you need it.

Other tips

- 1. Crushed conkers can be used up to 3 times to make liquid.
- 2. You can add crushed conkers into a cloth bag and use in the machine drum up to 4 times.
- 3. You can store laundry liquid in the fridge for 1 week
- 4. Conkers are poisonous if ingested, so take care with little ones around.
- 5. Conker wash works best when you wash between 40-60 degrees.

It has been good to see **Book Club** getting stuck into their new book this week. Ordinarily in the autumn term book club read the classic novel used by the Playhouse for their Christmas production, but this year we are doing something new whilst the Playhouse is being refurbished. Shorter, darker days focus the mind on **safety** on the walk to and from school. A local resident on **Wood Lane** contacted me because she was concerned that children from school have been climbing garden walls on Wood Lane and then emerging onto the driveway. She points out that cars reversing down believe that their way is clear as the children are

obscured by bushes, but then pop out with a great risk to their safety – there have been several near misses already. She further points out that the wall, despite having been strengthened, is not a safe structure and bits have already fallen so it is important that it does not get weakened further. I should add that we want to be courteous neighbours and so heavy footfall across a soil drive and the litter left behind are not us being our best. The wall on our side of the road is great for walking along, so please encourage your children to be safe and considerate when on the other side of the road. A parent has also highlighted a problem of sharps being seen behind the wall near the Arndale Centre at the top of Wood Lane. We have reported it to the neighbourhood team but it is a good time of year to remind children only to pick up things like conkers that they know what are.

We are **closed tomorrow** for one of the five statutory training days in the year. We will be having refresher training on Child Protection and Safer Working Practice.

We are looking forward to the Woodland Walk on Saturday which will give families a chance to meet each other whilst enjoying the autumn colours and a warm snack when they come back to school. All Shire Oak families are welcome, but Reception Class families usually find it a particularly good opportunity to get to know other parents and put faces to the names of their children's new friends.


