**Dear Parents and Carers** 

What a busy start to the final half term of the school year! It has been **Green Week** at Shire Oak and we have enjoyed a full programme of work around climate change, sustainable travel, where our food comes from, a love of nature and how to reduce/reuse/recycle. Each class has had input on **road safety** to help them be able to walk, scoot or cycle safely instead of travelling by car. On Wednesday afternoon we enjoyed **House Team Hobby Half Day** where we enjoyed a trip to the Ridge, crafts and costumes from reclaimed materials, learning about food miles, making fruit kebabs, music-making, etc. This week we have welcomed many visitors such as Sarah from Leeds DEC making wallets from Tetrapaks with Y4, Nigel from Green Up Your Act, parents sharing their sustainable transport vehicles and climate workshops, Liam from Natural England with activities on habitats, seed bombs and more, the catering agency to talk about food miles, Equans talking about plastic use in construction projects, Energy Heroes with art activities based on Andy Goldsworthy's work, Councillor Tim Goodall talking about our local area and then working with Nigel from the Woodhouse Ridge Action Group to explore the great outdoor space on our doorstep. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered or used their contacts to help us put together such a full programme. Year 6s also led a great assembly for school following their work on becoming Climate Ambassadors and this morning we enjoyed a sharing assembly with some of this work children have been doing in class.



Two trips this week have fitted nicely into our topic: Year 3 had a great Geography trip on Wednesday using maps and compasses well to hike up through Chevin Forest Park to the summit and then down to Otley bus station to return back to school. They showed excellent skills and resilience on a blustery and beautiful day. Year 5 are visiting the Veolia recycling centre and green wall today and I look forward to hearing all about it on their return.
