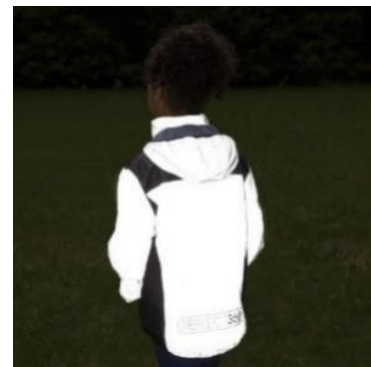
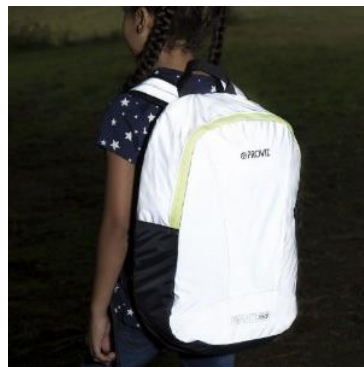

We were happy to invite them to school this weekend for some craft preparations and there are definitely some great ones to look out for.

At this time of year we enjoy the twinkling lights, but the early dark evenings brings their own challenges. Unfortunately, a Shire Oak pupil in Year 4 was **hit by a car** on his way home from after school club recently. The incident took place on the zebra crossing on Grove Lane. He and his family were on the crossing and a car failed to stop. Thankfully, he is now fully recovered from his injuries physically. However, understandably this has a huge impact on the whole family as his sister and dad witnessed this very distressing incident.

This incident proves how easily this could happen to any of our children despite the care and attention parents and carers give them on the way to and from school. The parents involved and Shire Oak school are keen to keep our children safe by lighting everyone up. We have a few ideas for Christmas presents and stocking fillers to suit all budgets that would help to illuminate your child. Proviz sell a range of fully reflective products including jackets and backpacks. They also sell, for a few pounds, small LED lights that can be fastened to items



of clothing, for example attached to the inside of coat pockets and taken out when walking home in the dark. Another fun option is to buy a roll of reflective adhesive tape (widely available online). Your children can have fun cutting out strips and shapes and sticking them to bags and coats. School have contacted the road safety unit at Leeds City Council to inform them of the accident and ask if they can advise or provide any reflective items.



Lighting up our children won't necessarily stop careless drivers, but it may just make drivers think more about other people and help them to see us on dark mornings and evening.

In happier news, Year 6 are currently at **Robinwood Centre** near Todmorden for their school residential. They are enjoying outdoor and adventurous activities away from home and school for three days. Going at this time of year does mean they have to wrap up warmly but does mean it is the cheapest possible time to go away.



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We love welcoming parents into school, but we are especially fortunate when they have skills and expertise that really support our children's learning. Kat Baxter, who works for Leeds Museums, came into school to support Y3 and Y4 in their 'When did Britain Begin?' topic bringing in **prehistoric objects** that were over two thousand years old! Christmas Celebrations

We continue as normal a curriculum as possible in the last few weeks of term, with some changes to allow for **Nativity rehearsals, etc.** We do like to mark the festival in school, however, so we will be having our **Christmas parties** on Thursday 19th December. On that day children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 can come to school in party clothes (that they can play outside in!) Years 3 to 6 can bring theirs in a named bag. Children eating school dinners will be given a special party lunch and children eating packed lunches may bring in more treat foods than usual. Headingley Preschool is an established and Outstanding Early Years setting, providing quality, affordable, inclusive early years education to our vibrant and diverse community since 1981.

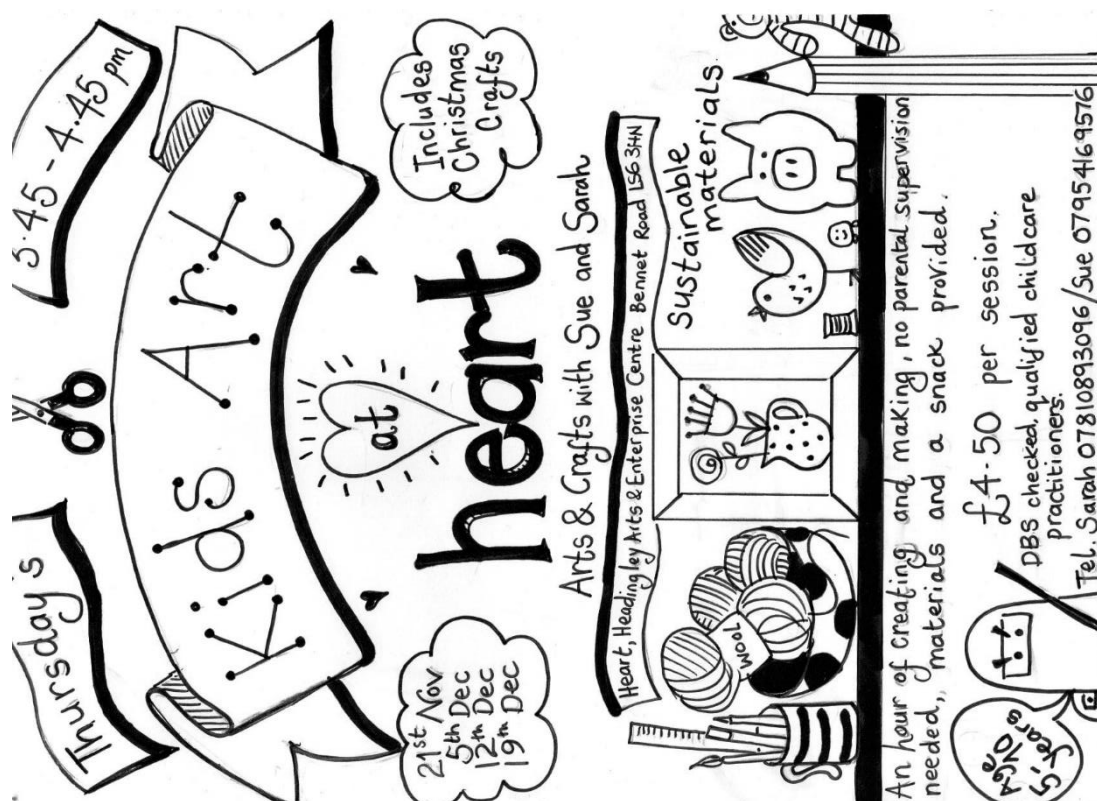
This vacancy is for a temporary SEND assistant (15 hours per week, 39 weeks per year), to support a wonderful child with special educational needs. This post is dependent upon SEND funding which follows the child, but could potentially be until August 2021. There is also the potential for the hours to increase, as the child increases their attendance.

Responsibilities: Key Person, to enable a child to independently access all the fun of our play focused preschool, planning for their individual needs, and recording their achievements using our online Learning Journal to help them reach their full potential. The successful applicant should be able to demonstrate a caring and encouraging approach. Ideally you would have previous experience of supporting children with additional needs in an early years setting. Knowledge of Makaton and Portage would be an advantage.

As the role involves observation, assessment and termly report writing, and liaising with colleagues and parents, excellent communication skills are required. All applicants require a minimum GCSE C Grade in both Maths and English, or equivalent, for this post. Early Years qualifications are also desirable. The offer of the post is dependent on the take up of references, and a DBS check.

Closing date for this position is the 2pm on 18th December 2019.
Interviews for this post will take place in the week beginning 6th January 2020
