



Dear Parents and Carers

**What a term!** One day back at school, several weeks of home learning and then back to school again. Although on the one hand it seems strange to be breaking up for a holiday already, on the other hand I can see that the children are ready for the break. They have dealt with such a lot of change to routine, they have had to rebuild up their stamina for early mornings and busy days and I can see that many of them are very, very tired. I hope that the Easter holidays give you all a chance for some downtime and perhaps the chance to see a few more friends and family members too.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the **Easter Raffle**. In the end we had 84 prizes and raised £200 which we will add to our ScrapShed total. Thank you Liz Craven for organising this.

I am pleased to say that the government have announced that **educational trips and visits** should soon be reinstated, in line with the national roadmap. This means that we will be able to run day trips after the Easter holidays, so long as the next step planned for the 12<sup>th</sup> April goes ahead. After that, the roadmap step of the 17<sup>th</sup> May (or the date that step happens) will mean that we will be able to take part in residential visits too. We are, therefore, planning for Y4 to do their annual trip to **Lineham Farm** straight after the May half term holiday. Lineham Farm is run by Leeds City Council and is fully risk assessed and when we are there we are the only school group using it, so will still be in our 'bubble'. Mr Chris Marshall has run this trip for many years, and so he will be working with Miss Helen Barley to plan and run this special trip. (They will be joined by two further members of Shire Oak staff.) Letters will come out after the Easter holidays, but we wanted to give as much warning as we can. Ordinarily we send out letters at the start of the year



and run a payment scheme over several months so families can spread the cost. This year we couldn't plan for the trip with any certainty, so didn't want to get the children's hopes up unnecessarily. We will still make sure that you can spread payments as we do not want cost to be a barrier to anyone taking part! (There is also an Opportunities Fund to help with subsidies, where needed.)



Thank you to you all for supporting our **birthday parties** this fortnight. The children have been excited about them in a way we have not seen in the past even for Christmas parties and class treats, so it is clear that they have been missing them and really enjoyed doing them as a group. Thank you for sorting out outfits, wrapping pass the parcel prizes, providing fabulous cakes and calming down giddy children at the end of the day.



As well as parties, there has been plenty of **learning** going on inside and outside the classroom and teachers have been busy diagnosing the areas of the curriculum that individuals, groups and whole classes need to revisit to be secure in their knowledge and understanding. One of the things that makes the biggest difference to readiness for learning is being in a good reading habit, so please encourage plenty of **reading** over the Easter holidays!
