This week the charity d:side have been in school teaching children about staying safe with medicines, alcohol and drugs. Our children have responded positively, as always. We know that helping children make decisions about their




health long before they are confronted with peer pressure and temptations is the best way to ensure they ready to good, choices when the


progress they have made so far this year.
